Job purpose

The post holder will be expected to make a strong contribution to teaching and to the operation of the School of Mathematics, Statistics and Actuarial Science (SMSAS) and will be expected to participate in the delivery of all our existing programmes.

Key accountabilities

- Undertake teaching of both undergraduate and postgraduate students, including providing support for student learning.
- Collaborate with colleagues in the School on course development, delivery and assessment, taking on appropriate administrative responsibilities.
- Act as personal tutor, giving first line support and providing mentorship.

Key duties

The principal duties and responsibilities of the successful candidate will be as follows:

Teaching:

- Deliver teaching to achieve the highest standards of student experience in a variety of settings from small tutorial groups to large lectures with the assistance of a mentor if required.
- Develop excellent teaching and learning support material across a range of modules.
- Set and mark assessments and examinations, providing timely feedback to students in a way that helps them develop their knowledge and skills.
- Supervise undergraduate and postgraduate students undertaking project work.
- Provide pastoral support to students.

Scholarship:

- Reflect on practice and the development of own teaching and learning skills.
- Maintain your own continuing professional development.

Administration:

- Take on appropriate administrative duties.
- Assist in meeting the requirements for the monitoring of teaching and learning, as prescribed by the University and external bodies.
- Participate in the student experience activities of the School.
- Contribute to recruitment, widening participation and public engagement activities within the school.
- Attend and contribute to School meetings.
- Help with other tasks relating to the running of the subject as they arise.

Such other duties, commensurate with the grading of the post, that may be assigned by the Head of School or their nominee.

- Ability to engage the interest and enthusiasm of students and inspire them to learn (I,T)
- Willingness and ability to contribute to the student experience activities of the School (A,I)
- Evidence of, and a personal commitment to developing excellence in both teaching and student experience (I)
- Willingness to engage in continuous professional development (I)
- Firm commitment to achieving the University's vision and values, with a passion for a transformative student experience and multidisciplinary, impactful research (I)
- Commitment to deliver and promote equality, diversity and inclusivity in the day to day work of the role (I)

- Teaching experience relevant to UK HE, including development of materials (A,I)

- Experience in designing and supervising UG and MSc projects in Statistics or Data Science (A,I)
